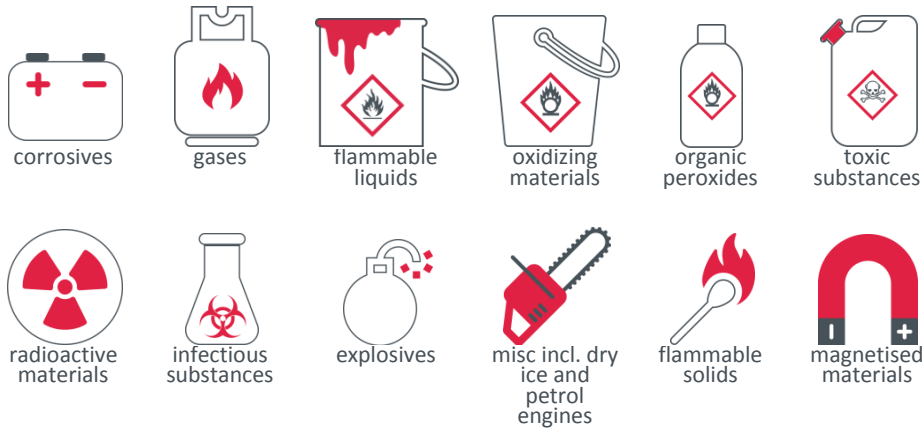


## PROHIBITED DANGEROUS GOODS



### Transport of dangerous goods is forbidden onboard our aircraft

Dangerous goods include articles and substances which are flammable, corrosive, toxic, oxidizing, explosive, radioactive, infectious, compressed gases, dangerous when wet, spontaneously combustible, self reactive, organic peroxides, dangerous to the environment and other regulated material. ## LITHIUM BATTERIES



### Spare batteries may not be placed in checked baggage

Phone, Laptop and other electronic devices may contain lithium batteries. Lithium battery can be carried by air or not depends on its configuration. Phone, tablet, laptop in normal conditions are allowed in cabin. Additional information are available, please request information in case of any doubt.

Some dangerous goods are allowed under conditions. Please refer to the following or request information in case of any doubt.

## CABIN LUGGAGE PROHIBITED ARTICLES

**A- Guns, firearms and other devices that discharge projectiles** — devices capable, or appearing capable, of being used to cause serious injury by discharging a projectile, including:

- firearms of all types, such as pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns
- toy guns, replicas and imitation firearms capable of being mistaken for real weapons component parts of firearms, excluding telescopic sights
- compressed air and CO<sub>2</sub> guns, such as pistols, pellet guns, rifles and ball bearing guns
- signal flare pistols and starter pistols
- bows, cross bows and arrows
- harpoon guns and spear guns
- slingshots and catapults

**B- Stunning devices** — devices designed specifically to stun or immobilise, including:

- devices for shocking, such as stun guns, tasers and stun batons
- animal stunners and animal killers
- disabling and incapacitating chemicals, gases and sprays, such as mace, pepper sprays, capsaicin sprays, tear gas, acid sprays and animal repellent sprays

**C- Objects with a sharp point or sharp edge** — objects with a sharp point or sharp edge capable of being used to cause serious injury, including:

- items designed for chopping, such as axes, hatchets and cleavers
- ice axes and ice picks
- razor blades
- box cutters
- knives with blades of more than 6 cm
- scissors with blades of more than 6 cm as measured from the fulcrum
- martial arts equipment with a sharp point or sharp edge
- swords and sabres

**D- Workmen's tools** — tools capable of being used either to cause serious injury or to threaten the safety of aircraft, including:

- crowbars
- drills and drill bits, including cordless portable power drills
- tools with a blade or a shaft of more than 6 cm capable of use as a weapon, such as screwdrivers and chisels
- saws, including cordless portable power saws
- blowtorches
- bolt guns and nail guns

**E- Blunt instruments** — objects capable of being used to cause serious injury when used to hit, including:

- baseball and softball bats
- clubs and batons, such as billy clubs, blackjacks and night sticks
- martial arts equipment

**F- Explosives and incendiary substances and devices** — explosives and incendiary substances and devices capable, or appearing capable, of being used to cause serious injury or to pose a threat to the safety of aircraft, including:

- ammunition
- blasting caps
- detonators and fuses
- replica or imitation explosive devices
- mines, grenades and other explosive military stores
- fireworks and other pyrotechnics
- smoke-generating canisters and smoke-generating cartridges
- dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives

## DANGEROUS GOODS TOLERANCE

**1-Oxygen or air, gaseous, cylinders required for medical use.**

No more than 5 kg gross mass per cylinder

Note: Liquid oxygen systems are forbidden for transport.

**2-Ammunition (cartridges for weapons), securely packaged,** in quantities not exceeding 5 kg gross weight per person for that person's own use. Allowances for more than one person must not be combined into one or more packages.

**3-Electro shock weapons (e.g. Tasers)** containing dangerous goods such as explosives, compressed gases, lithium batteries, etc. are forbidden in carry-on baggage or checked baggage or on the person. **FORBIDDEN**

**4-Fuel cells** containing fuel, powering portable electronic devices (e.g. cameras, cellular phones, laptop computers and camcorders) **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**5-Fuel cell cartridges** spare for portable electronic devices

**6-Gas cylinders, non-flammable, non-toxic** worn for the operation of mechanical limbs. Also, spare cylinders of a similar size if required to ensure an adequate supply for the duration of the journey.

**7-Mobility aids:** Battery-powered wheelchairs or other similar mobility devices with non-spillable wet batteries or with batteries

**8-Mobility aids:** Battery-powered wheelchairs or other similar mobility devices with spillable batteries or with lithium batteries

**9-Mobility aids:** Battery-powered mobility aids with lithium ion batteries (collapsible) **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**10-Camping stoves and fuel containers that have contained a flammable liquid fuel,** with empty fuel tank and/or fuel container

**11-Lithium Batteries: Security-type equipment containing lithium batteries** **PROHIBITED ON CARRY ON BAGGAGES**

**12-Lithium Batteries: Portable electronic devices containing lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries,** including medical devices such as portable oxygen concentrators (POC) and consumer electronics such as cameras, mobile phones, laptops and tablets, when carried by passengers or crew for personal use. For lithium metal batteries the lithium metal content must not exceed 2 g and for lithium ion batteries the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh

Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage.

**13-Lithium ion battery electronic devices.** Lithium ion batteries for portable (including medical) electronic devices, a Wh rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh. For portable medical electronic devices only, lithium metal batteries with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g.

Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage.

**14-Lithium batteries, spare/loose** with a Watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh for consumer electronic devices and PMED or with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g for PMED only. Maximum of two spare batteries in carry-on baggage only.

These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.

**PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**15-Batteries, spare/loose,** including lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries, for portable electronic devices must be carried in carry-on baggage only. Articles which have the primary purpose as a power source, e.g. power banks are considered as spare batteries. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**16-Portable electronic devices containing non-spillable batteries,** and must be 12 V or less and 100 Wh or less. A maximum of 2 spare batteries may be carried

**17-Hair curlers containing hydrocarbon gas,** up to one (1) per passenger or crew-member, provided that the safety cover is securely fitted over the heating element. **These hair curlers must not be used on board the aircraft at any time.** Gas refills for such curlers are not permitted in checked or carry-on baggage.

**18-Insulated packagings containing refrigerated liquid nitrogen** (dry shipper), fully absorbed in a porous material containing only non-dangerous goods.

**19-Internal combustion or fuel cell engines**

**20-Lamps, energy efficient** when in retail packaging intended for personal or home use.

**21-Mercury barometer or thermometer** carried by a representative of a government weather bureau or similar official agency

**PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**22-Avalanche rescue backpack:** one (1) per person, containing a cartridge of compressed gas in Div. 2.2. May also be equipped with a pyrotechnic trigger mechanism containing no more than 200 mg net of Div. 1.4S. The backpack must be packed in such a manner that it cannot be accidentally activated. The airbags within the backpacks must be fitted with pressure relief valves.

**23-Carbon dioxide, solid (dry ice)** in quantities not exceeding 2.5 kg per person when used to pack perishables not subject to these Regulations in checked or carry-on baggage, provided the baggage (package) permits the release of carbon dioxide gas. Checked baggage must be marked "dry ice" or "carbon dioxide, solid" and with the net weight of dry ice or an indication that there is 2.5 kg or less dry ice.

**24-Chemical Agent Monitoring Equipment** when carried by staff members of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons on official travel

**25-Heat producing articles** such as underwater torches (diving lamps) and soldering irons.

**26-Radioisotopic cardiac pacemakers** or other devices, including those powered by lithium batteries, implanted into a person or fitted externally, or radiopharmaceuticals contained within the body of a person as the result of medical treatment. **ONLY ALLOWED ON ONE'S PERSON**

**27-Small non-flammable gas cylinders,** containing carbon dioxide or other suitable gas. Up to two small cylinders fitted into a self-inflating safety device such as a life jacket. Not more than one (1) device per passenger up to two (2) spare small cartridges per person, not more than four (4) cartridges up to 50 mL water capacity for other devices

**28-Matches, safety (one small packet) or a small cigarette lighter** that does not contain unabsorbed liquid fuel, other than liquefied gas, intended for use by an individual when carried on the person. Lighter fuel and lighter refills are not permitted on one's person or in checked or carry-on baggage. **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD AND CARRY ON BAGGAGES. ONLY ALLOWED ON ONE'S PERSON**

Note: "Strike anywhere" matches, "Blue flame" or "Cigar" lighters are forbidden.

**29-Disabling devices** such as mace, pepper spray, etc. containing an irritant or incapacitating substance are forbidden on the person, in checked and carry-on baggage. **FORBIDDEN**

**30-Electronic cigarettes:** These devices must be kept on the person only and **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**31-Alcoholic beverages,** when in retail packagings, containing more than 24% but not more than 70% alcohol by volume, in receptacles not exceeding 5 L, with a total net quantity per person of 5 L.

**32-Non-radioactive medicinal or toiletry articles** (including aerosols) such as hair sprays, perfumes, colognes and medicines containing alcohol; and

**33-Non-flammable, non-toxic aerosols** in Division 2.2, with no subsidiary risk, for sporting or home use. The total net quantity of non-radioactive medicinal or toiletry articles and non-flammable, non-toxic aerosols in Division 2.2 must not exceed 2 kg or 2 L and the net quantity of each single article must not exceed 0.5 kg or 0.5 L. Release valves on aerosols must be protected by a cap or other suitable means to prevent inadvertent release of the contents. **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**34-Instruments containing radioactive material** (i.e. chemical agent monitor (CAM) and/or rapid alarm and identification device monitor (RAID-M))

**35-Permeation devices** for calibrating air quality monitoring equipment **PROHIBITED IN CARGO HOLD**

**36-Security-type attaché cases, cash boxes, cash bags,** etc. incorporating dangerous goods, such as lithium batteries and/or pyrotechnic material are totally **PROHIBITED ON CARRY ON BAGGAGES**

**37-Non-infectious specimens,** packed with small quantities of flammable liquid

**38-Thermometer, medical or clinical,** which contains mercury, one (1) per person for personal use, when in its protective case. **PROHIBITED ON CARRY ON BAGGAGES**
